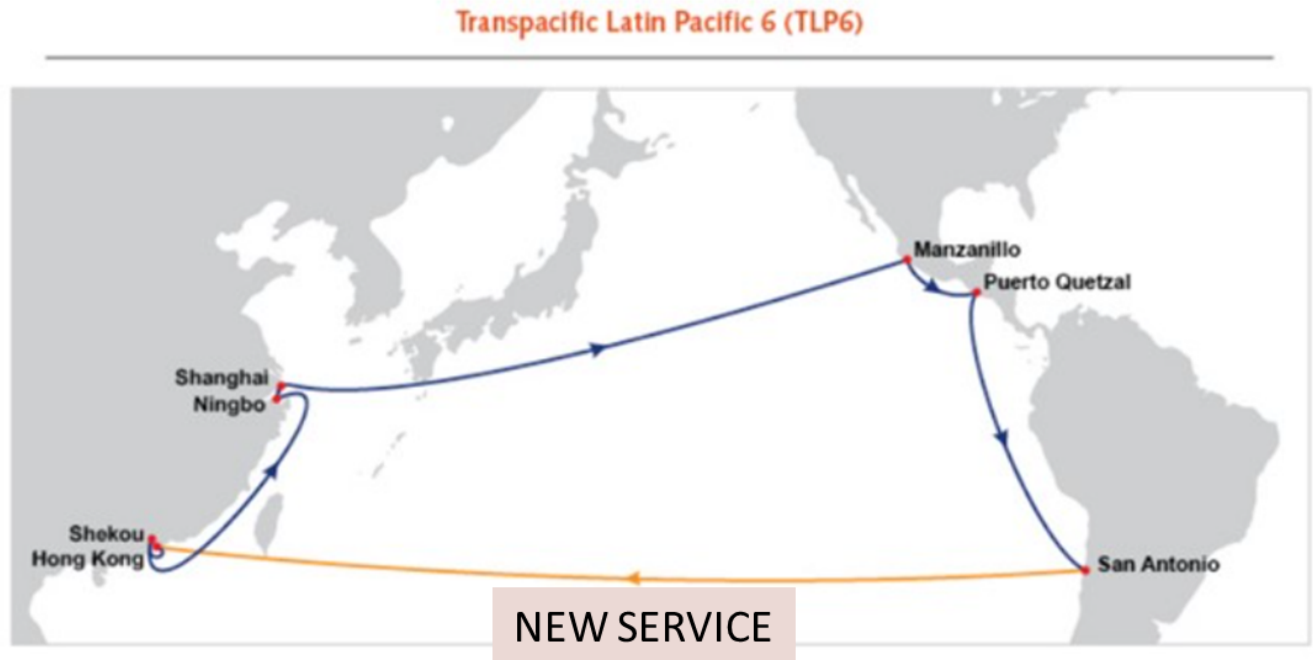
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New Service: Transpacific Latin Pacific 6 (TLP6)

To enhance our network coverage in the Latin America region, we are pleased to introduce a new service— Transpacific Latin Pacific 6 (TLP6) in our Asia to Latin America network which will provide a comprehensive port coverage between North East Asia and West Coast South America.

In addition to OOCL's existing TLP1, TLP2, TLP3 services, TLP6 will provide direct connections from China to Mexico, Guatemala, and Chile. This will offer a competitive transit time of only 22 days from Shanghai to Puerto Quetzal (Guatemala) and 32 days to San Antonio (Chile).

Did you know: there are multiple ways to submit VGM?

Verified Gross Mass (VGM) is the total gross mass of a packed container which includes the cargo weight, block and bracing materials, and container tare.

OOCL encourages the use of electronic submission of VGM to avoid potential delays in the loading of your cargo on to the vessel.

VGM via EDI

OOCL supports VGM declaration via EDI and we accept the following EDI standard:

- VGM Submission (VERMAS) – Preferred
- Shipping Instruction (IFTMIN / 304)

VGM via Excel File on OOCL.com

1. Download the Excel Form using this [link](#) and then open the Excel file.
2. On the “Declaration” tab, read the General Usage Agreement.
3. Click the “I Agree” box.
4. Open the “VGM Template” tab.
5. Enter information for at least the minimum required data fields listed below and in red font on the Excel Form:
 - Carrier = “OOCL” (This will self-populate as you enter container #)
 - Booking #
 - Container #
 - Verified Gross Mass
 - VGM Unit (select kilograms or pounds using the drop-down arrow)
 - Authorized Person (information must be entered in ALL CAPS)

VGM via My OOCL Center (MOC)

Within MOC, there is a VGM module that allows you to submit your VGM via the VGM declaration that features 2 methods: Method 1 and Method 2, which the latter requires tare and cargo weight. For questions on how to submit VGM via MOC, please contact OOCLCOM@oocl.com.

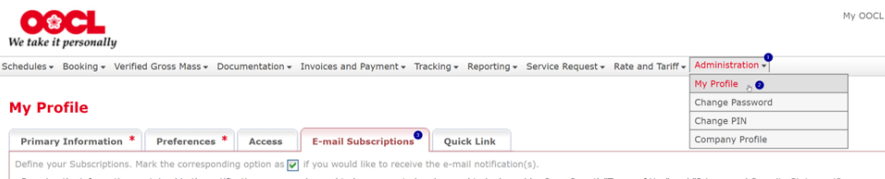


Shipment Exception Alerts- ETA and ETD

My OOCL Center allows users to setup e-mail notifications to any updates or changes to ETA and ETD to assist handling of shipments and exception management.

To access the “Shipment Exception Alerts”, log into MOC and click on the “Administration” main menu option and then select “My profile.” Click on the “Email Subscription” tab.

Scroll down to the “Shipment Exception Alerts” section. To activate the notification, please check the ✓ box next to the category and click on the “Save” button at the end of the page.

ETD and ETA Changes Alerts

- **Export:** Estimated Date of **Departure changed at first port of load** will provide customer any changes to the estimated departure date/time at first port of load. Click [Sample](#) to view E-mail.
- **Import:** Estimated Date of **Arrival changed at last port of discharge** will provide customer any changes to the estimated arrival date/time at last port of discharge. Click [Sample](#) to view E-mail.

PRO TIP Last Free Day

My OOCL Center allows you to view the demurrage and detention Last Free Day (LFD) for import containers on your bills of lading using My OOCL Center or OOCL's public website.

Log into MOC

Log into your "My OOCL Center" at www.oocl.com with your user ID and password.

Use the search box on the MOC welcome page

Enter the bill of lading number and select "Shipment Details."

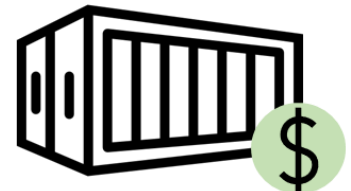
